
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

been a Willys fan for a long time. When I was a teenager in southern California, my friends and I hardly ever missed the Gas Coupe "Wars".




I have a couple of friends in Australia



Sunday the sun came out and dried the track.







Jim Tipper's just right 33 must have felt right at home in the Fremont pits, it has all the right stuff for Nostalgia racing.




Bill Fitting's blown, 4 speed 33 pulled the front wheels with every shift!










Another old gasser in attendance was the old Roy Brizio 33 pick-up. In primer and not yet running, the truck will soon be restored.

VICTOR YOUNG #001 CAMARILLO CA

Victor's coupe is well under way to being a real clean street car.Rear fenders and tilt front end are 'glass items. Engine is 355 Chevy with Man-a-Fre 4 carb manifold, Turbo 400 leads to Dana 60 rear end. Color will be metallic blue with charcoal chassis and interior.

VINCENT CORIGLIANO #015 LIBERTY NY

Vincent is the owner of the Willy Works, (see ad this issue) His all glass 33 coupe is powered by a blown LS7 454. Trans is a TH 350 rebuilt by Scott Corigliano who also built the engine and headers. Rearend is a Ford 9" with 3.55 gears, chassis is by Martz engineering. Although street driven regularly this car will run a 9.5 % mile at 130 mph! Color is Lincoln burgandy.




MARTY GOLDSMITH #41 BURBANK CA

Shown here in as purchased condition, Marty's 41 will soon be getting a state of the art, Pro-stock style chassis. Blown big block Chevy engine is finised and ready to drop in. Car will be Probuilt and have strut front end.

JIM FALSCHLEHNER #024 TUSTIN CA

15 year old Jim is our youngest member so far, he has done all the work on his 40 pick-up himself including building the frame, recessing the firewall, custom tailgate and much more! Small-block Chevy and Turbo 400 will be used, rearend is narrowed 9", stock front axel has 61 econoline spindles and brakes, steering is Corvair. Body is all steel.







STEVE SPENCE #33 APTOS CA

Purchased as an 80% finished street rod, this steel 33 (glass front end & rear fenders) has since been completely rebuilt to Steves spec's by HOT RODS OF SANTA CRUZ. 355 Chevy is full of goodies and topped off with a BDS 6.71 blower.Narrowed 57 olds rear end has 4.56 posi, ladder bars and Aldon coil-overs. Built in 8 months for a total of \$30,000 this orange street rod has run an 11.80 at 123 mph Other features are custom 2x3 rect' tube frame, tube front axel with Bell discs, Tilton pedal assembly, Beard bucket seats and 6 point roll cage.




BILL BRADLEY #010 SATICOY CA

Bills coupe has scratch built frame from the firewall forward with coil-over mounted tube axel, height is fully adjustable. Car has 'glass front end, rear fenders, trunk-lid and doors. Bills 41 is still in the construction stages and will run small block chevy and Turbo 400.



JAY SOUZA #018 DANVILLE CA

Jay has what must be one of the most colorful 41 coupes around! This low-slung race only Willys runs in the tens. Car rides on a set of polished Weld wheels



JAMES TIPPER #055 FREMONT CA

This chopped 33 is the old Brasher & Cummings A/gas car. It has gone the full circle from strip to street and now back to the strip. Engine is alcohol injected, 6/71 blown 58 Chrysler Hemi. Wheels are polished Halibrands on rear and American spindle mounts up front. Chrome, dropped tube axel is used. Paint color is red.



DAVID JACKSON #053 LEESBURG VA

Davids 41 sedan is all steel and set up to cruise in comfort. Independent front end is from a Mustang II and the rear clip of a 72 Chevelle chassis was grafted to the Willys frame for a coil spring set up.A 350 - Chevy engine & 350 Turbo trans' are used. Paint is Burgandy Imron by Bruce Paraday who also did the bodywork.




GARY CERIO #067 RENO NV

Gary's coupe is in the early stages of construction, being built for the street it will run 327 Chevy with powerglide. The chassis is boxed, front end is straight tube axel and stock leaf springs. Stock Pontiac rear end is held in place by coil-over shocks and ladder bars. Chassis work was done by master race car builder of the 60's, Don Long.

DAVE MILLER #062 BUTLER PA

When Dave's 40 is finished it will see street use and also run at Nostalgia drag events. Engine is a healthy 302 Chevy backed up by a B&M 4 spd Olds Hydro. This car was a B/Gasser back in the 60's so natrually has a 57 Olds rear end. Front leaf springs and straight tube axel are chrome plated along with rear 4-bars and leaf springs. Car will look sharp when finished with Matador Red paint and all original chrome trim and mouldings.



JAMES SNYDER #076 MILPITAS CA

This bright yellow, 396 Chevy powered coupe is another old gasser now seeing street duty. It has all the classic gasser stuff like 'glass front end, rear fenders and trunk lid, ballast rear bumper, 57 Pontiac rear end (4.88 ratio), hood scoop and roll bar. Basically stock engine pushes car to 13.20 ET's at 108 MPH. Centerline wheels are used all 'round. Not noticable at first are widened rear fenders.


hobby shop and pick up a couple of Willys models. You don't have to build them stock out of the box. There are as many ways to build a model as there are to build a full size car.

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

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
