

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

Enclosed is a picture of the 1941 Willys Coupe I just purchased. This car was raced by Rod Tomasini of the "Road Knights" car club in Crescent City, California, during the late 60's. The last year it was raced was 1967 and it ran a best of 10.99. The engine was a 327 Chev' +.060, Isky 550 cam, Mondello heads, Goodies Speed Shop headers, dual AFB's, Olds' 4-spd hydro' and 10 bolt Chev' rear end with 5:38

Future plans call for 2x3 tube frame, 10 point cage, dropped axle, 4-spd, 9" Ford rear with spool and axles by Summers Brothers and

JFZ disc brakes.

Engine will be a 327 with Hilborn Injectors, Venolia pistons, Joe Hunt magneto, Milodon 4 bolt caps, Erson 990B cam, Crane rockers, Dyna -Rev crank, steel rods, McLeod flywheel/ pressure plate and heads by Bernard Mondello.

Wheels are Halibrands with Goodyear slicks and frontrunners, rack and pinion steering, Moon tank, ladder bars and 5:43 gears finish it


Last time I counted, we had over 25 members in Canada. I hope you guys all get in touch with Bob, I'm sure a national Canadian roster is possible.

I am writing to update you on the construction of my'36 coupe, (see issue # 9). I discovered that the previous owner was Bill Bowman who owns the orange '33 cabriolet seen in all the magazines. 




Dominic behind the wheel at age $2\frac{1}{2}$, now his feet can reach the pedals.









RIGHT: '33 panel is Jody's project, Jody is 13 years old.








LEFT: Tom's current project is this Pro-Street '41 coupe. It should hit the the road in about a year.





SETH SHAW #583 SAYVILLE, NY

Jack is famous for his fire breathing AA/Gas '33 coupe, but there is another side to Jack. Being built in Jack's garage, alongside the race car, is a full fendered '33 roadster for the street! Roadster will feature suicide doors, side curtains, billet windshield posts, chopped/removable top and wheelie bars! Wheels will be Halibrands. Jack has located all steel front sheetmetal. 





DAVE PURDIE #470 N. AMHERSTBURG, ONT', CANADA


HARRY YONTZ #462 ROYAL OAK, MI

Here is a shot of Harry's '42 4-door sedan. It's completely stock and was purchased this year in Ohio.


ROGER KLEINSMITH #586 WELLAND, ONT', CANADA



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RICK ANTLES #370 GOLETA, CA




hinges with quick release hinge pins.
Rick is one talented guy and it will
be no secret when this car hits the
scene. He designed and built his own chassis using Art Morrison 2x3, mandrel bent, main rails and 1 5/8"tubing,10 pt roll cage. It all went together in the super slick chassis jig Rick built for the job. Morrison also supplied the rear coil-overs, ladder bars and wheelie bars. Plenty of attention also went into the front superprise. the front suspension. Strut front ends are not too common and not too easy to

are not too common and not too easy to fit under a Willys. Rick used Morrison struts and Pinto rack and pinion steering, LS7 454 Chevy engine features Crane roller cam and rockers, dual Dominators, ported heads and Vertex mag'. Racer Brown supplied the reverse shift pattern Turbo-400. Rear end is a narrowed and braced Ford 9". It has Strange Eng' 33 spline axles, spool and nodular 3rd member. 4.86, Richmond Pro gears are used. Wheels are Welds with Firestone rubber. Wheels are Welds with Firestone rubber. Wilwood disc brakes are used all round. Rick does precision sheetmetal for a

living so you can bet his car will have some trick tin work coming up.

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


